Seam

Through a simple series of cuts, folds and joins, Seam is materialised with elegant and precise form. The Seam collection is conceived with a design process not dissimilar to the way in which a piece of fabric is tailored into a form-fitting garment. A refined 'seam' along the spine of the chair makes reference to a seam detail used in clothing construction. Spanning commercial to residential applications including hospitality, breakout, alfresco and balconies, the Seam collection is designed for outdoor use, though is equally at home indoors.




Breeze

Our Makers Mark

EVERY PIECE PRODUCED BY TAIT REFLECTS MORE THAN 25 YEARS OF AUTHENTIC DESIGN, QUALITY AND CRAFTSMANSHIP.

One of the earliest forms of trademarking, Makers Marks have been used by craftsmen for centuries to claim and assure responsibility for their work. From silver to stone and porcelain to paintings, Makers Marks are etched in history as means of identifying and revealing the authenticity of a finished piece.

As creators of original and authentic Australian design, Tait apply their own Makers Mark across their iconic collections. Established in 1992 by Gordon and Susan Tait, the design of the motif symbolises Tait's heritage. The contemporary T symbol at the heart of the Tait Makers Mark is a distinct representation of the Tait story. Two structural frames surrounding the T symbolise Tait's design headquarters and factory rooted in the Australian design industry. The convergence of these two frames represents the unification between Tait's passionate craftsmen and Tait's collaboration with leading Australian designers.

Only after considerable testing and inspection will a product bear the Tait Makers Mark. Applied by pressure, the stamp is permanently embossed onto the material. A stitched label featuring the Makers' Mark is also carefully sewn across Tait's upholstery and soft furnishings.

Tait's Makers Mark affirms your piece as one of originality and quality, made to last a lifetime.

Paramount to the Tait philosophy is collaboration and mentoring of emerging and established Australian designers, supporting local design and arts bodies from grass roots to professional industry, engaging Australian suppliers and manufacturing entirely onshore in Australia.

Through a long product lifecycle, sourcing sustainable materials, waste reduction initiatives, manufacturing locally as well as upholding ethical social responsibilities, Tait strive toward minimising their environmental and social impact.

ADAM CORNISH

Renowned Australian designer, Adam Cornish, works from an independent, multidisciplinary design studio in Melbourne and exhibits an impressive portfolio comprising furniture, homewares and installation. Cornish has received a number of awards and achievements throughout his young career, notably, working with luxury Italian brand Alessi, exhibiting at Salone del Mobile Milan and ICFF New York as well as receiving DENFAIR'S 'Best Australian Product' for Tait's Seam dining chair.





ADAM GOODRUM

As one of Australia's leading industrial designers, Adam Goodrum is world renowned for his design innovation and distinct Australian aesthetic. Goodrum's unfaltering drive to create original design has resulted in collaborations with leading Australian design houses including Tait, Cult and Dessein, with international clients including Cappellini, Alessi, Normann Copenhagen, Veuve Clicquot & Wallpaper*. Additionally, Goodrum was awarded DENFAIR'S 'Best Product' for Tait's Trace collection.



NANCY JI

Nancy Ji is an architect and designer with a philosophy to create works which are functional, simple and with an element of playfulness. Ji was educated in New Zealand, USA and the Netherlands, before completing a Master's of Architecture at the University of Melbourne. In 2016 Nancy was the recipient of the Mercedes Benz Design Award, which saw her winning piece, the Lily Tray Table be produced by Tait.



TRENT JANSEN

Trent Jansen works from an independent industrial design studio in Sydney where he creates honest, poetic and sustainable design. Jansen develops pieces that aim to foster a lasting relationship with the user. Accolades include: Space + Edra Residency, the 'Pregnant Chair' for Moooi, Bombay Sapphire 'Design Discovery Award', Melbourne Design Award 2016 for 'Best Product Design' (Home & Garden), London Design Museum's 'Design of the Year' Award and IDEA's 'Emerging Designer' Award.

Rina and Kelly formed bernabeifreeman in 2002 and their range of lighting, textiles and furniture has been widely published and exhibited, including at the Powerhouse Museum, Salone del Mobile and The Milan Triennale. They have won numerous design awards, including IDEA awards for product design and the Bombay Sapphire Design Discovery Award. bernabeifreeman continue to research the relationships end users have with the products they live with, emphasising the importance of the longevity of products for sustainability in design.

Justin Hutchinson is a Melbourne-based industrial designer, lecturer and urban innovator who is a firm believer in the positive value of design. Hutchinson's experience with outdoor products and environmental design sparked his research into the duality between the manufactured and the natural environment – designing for longevity, and ultimately trying to forge a way for the man-made to co-exist with the natural environment.
